

Superintendent Report 2016

In this 92nd Council of the Peninsular Florida District we are taking an opportunity to touch base with our "core values" as a Fellowship. According to corporate strategy experts "missional drift" is deadly for any organization. In the Kingdom of God, it is apostasy, blasphemy and sin! To protect against such drifting we must periodically review those values which define our reason for being, caused our original formation, and constitute our foundations. During our time together here at Victory Church in Lakeland we will look at many of the values that make us what we are as Pentecostal, missions minded, and church planting Believers.

In their book, *Leadership: A Communication Perspective*, Michael Hackman and Craig Johnson state "Values are uncompromisable, undebatable truths that drive and direct behavior. They are motivational – they give us reason *why* we do things; and they are restrictive – they place boundaries around behavior." So then, our central values must be respected and protected. They give us direction and energy for our journey. They also keep us from the dreaded drift that would take us away from our most revered, cherished and meaningful goals. We must fix our minds, hearts and souls upon those timeless truths at the core of our faith and crux of our work and activities. As the Proverb instructs: "Do not move an ancient boundary stone set up by your forefathers." (22:28) So what are the values that drive and direct our efforts?

MINISTRY

Peninsular Florida continues to experience a genuine season of blessings from the Lord. In his first year as our District Youth Director, Casey Casal wasted no time in extending the tremendous success of PFYouth. We miss Al Force and Jinny but the values they left provide a solid foundation. Casey and Lenore have built on that foundation by having a powerful Youth Leaders Conference, new missions trips and adding a new young adult age camp. Speed the Light giving approached a half million Dollars, youth camps at Masterpiece Gardens were at record levels, and our PK Retreat was outstanding. The convention, Fusion, saw a true two night revival among our youth. Again, PFYouth had the best District Fine Arts Festival in the Fellowship and dominated the National FAF Festival last summer in Louisville, Kentucky. Our core values are producing current results!

Deanna Shrodes keeps expanding the boundaries of PFWomen's Ministries. The publications, podcasts and radio broadcasts all proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ and report the advance of Women's Ministries in our District. Thrive, the annual convention, grew again in attendance, spiritual power and miraculous altar and prayer services. New outreaches to Africa were added to existing inspiration on the Couch Tour and Stronger, a unique training event for women in the Assemblies of God, added value and effectiveness to our core. Susan Pippin continues to serve at an excellent level as our Female Presbyter. Her social media pages, media and print communications, and pulpit ministry gives undeniable proof of the anointing God has placed upon women Ministers, and the women in ministry, in Peninsular Florida.

Girl's Ministries has entered a new era. Bonnie Pait has extended and expanded the quality contributions Deborah Chapin made for so many years. Bonnie and her leaders have doubled the Powette attendance, raised BGMC giving to historic highs and brought Girl's Ministry support to the Sectional and local church level. More girls in our churches are learning the core principles of Christian discipleship, faith, and a righteous lifestyle through Bonnie's faithful efforts and tireless work.

PFDC Royal Rangers has been a leader among our General Council Ranger programs for many years. Doug Moon is enhancing Camp Wilderness as he expands this strategically important ministry to boys and men. He has coordinated and directed the construction of a beautiful new covered stage, with lighting, sound, storage and theatric capabilities. The new platform improves meetings, dramas, worship and ministry at Wilderness. In addition, the facility makes the property more attractive to renters and outside church groups. The value of this vital tradition is constantly increasing.

PFMen are growing in ministry, fellowship and missions as John Hensel and our Sectional Reps lead the way. The return of the annual men's convention, MoMENtum, has provided hundreds an opportunity for revival and spiritual growth. Armor Bearers provide financial support so the regional and local events can be dedicated to ministering to men. John and his team are doing things like fishing tournaments, golf outings, and trips that attract men and give them opportunities to work for the Lord.

Aaron Burke is infusing new energy and vision into our Young Leaders. As the PFDC under 40 Presbyter he is renewing regional meetings and working to include our "rising generation" in the life of Peninsular Florida. The Wisdom Conference on Monday afternoon at this Council will demonstrate the broad vision he is providing for this generation. Missions will be the theme and emphasis, giving definition and challenge to our younger Ministers. After the Monday evening Keynote Rally we will all enjoy a new format of fellowship due to his desire to provide a meaningful time of interaction for Council. We will eat, visit, talk and encourage one another along with the young leaders. Fellowship is one of our core values and this will be a perfect expression of that part of our tradition.

Adult Ministries is now "Finish Strong"! Ken Pippin is committed to providing quality social and spiritual opportunities to this important age group. The cruises and seasonal regional meetings have given a new platform for these saints to Finish Strong. In a special innovation, Ken has led a cooperative effort with Casey Casal and the PFYouth creating connections between older Christians and troubled kids and teens. The Christian seniors can serve as surrogate grandparents to the kids, offering love, advice, support, life lessons and spiritual guidance. Great idea! None of us want to start life strong then finish weak. Ken's leadership is helping extend our values to another generation!

Michael Nelson is following the footsteps of Malcolm Burleigh as a district and national leader in ethnic, urban and black ministry. His anointing will be evident as he ministers in the Memorial and Communion service in this Council. However, it is important to note that his vision and leadership has opened new missions giving in the National Black Fellowship for ministry and church planting in the urban centers of America. President Nelson provides effective leadership for our Peninsular Florida Black Fellowship and serves us well as a Presbyter. The Great Commission demands we go into all the world and preach the Gospel to every person. That includes all ethnicities and socio-economic groups. Pastor Nelson understands that challenge and is answering with ideas to reach into every neighborhood in the inner cities of this peninsula and across our nation. In spite of the problems there, our core values hold true and are effective in the most damaged population centers in America. The Black fellowships have a call and strategy to go and meet those needs.

MISSIONS

You will hear this many times during this Council: Peninsular Florida BGMC achieved the astounding accomplishment of being the first district in history to give ONE MILLION DOLLARS to missions! Steve Powell, Sydney Morrow, Chuck Padgett, our Kids Church Pastors and PFKids leaders are to be commended for this awesome achievement. EIGHT of the top ten giving churches in the nation are PFDC congregations! PFDC has led the nation for more than a decade and continues to increase the vision, possibilities and victories for our missionaries. One of our foundational core values is to preach the Good News of Jesus Christ to all the world and BGMC are helping us do just that!

Again in 2016 Peninsular Florida was the number one World Missions giving District in the General Council. There is a reason our BGMC, STL, LFTL and general giving is increasing. Our Pastors and congregations understand the heart of God for His creation. Redemption! Every year **Tom Manning** has been our PFDC World Missions Director, we have led the nation in overall missions giving! This year we will help rebuild the church buildings destroyed by the earthquake in Nepal. Tom knows missions first hand. He and Candi served in Europe and built a great missions giving church in Austria. Now they lead CLC in Fort Lauderdale and our district mission ministries. The core value is the Gospel. The core function is missions. Tom is doing a marvelous job directing both operations.

Scott Young has breathed new life into church planting in Peninsular Florida. Last year we planted a number of congregations. We are now working through the adjustments that pioneering always requires. In the last three District Councils we have seen upward trends in *PFMissions (Home Missions) offerings* for the first time in almost 30 years! This is a time of multiplication for our District and we are grateful for the vision, faith and strategy of the combined efforts of Steve Coad, Church Planting and Greg Evans faithful work with the US Missionaries as they give direction and encouragement. The multicultural side of City Reach has expanded the number of PAC and Plants in Pen FL as Scott coordinates the various assignments. Again, this year, we will feature PFMissions and church planting during the Keynote Rally on Monday night. This is a moment of multiplication and we want to fuel the momentum!

DISCIPLESHIP AND EDUCATION

The International League of Christian Schools continues to grow and prosper. Executive Director Michael Burroughs is adding campuses that bring new students, faculty and staff members to our membership. ILCS and FLOCS holds the highest accreditation available to schools, public or private, and our graduates are qualified to apply to any school, college or university in the world. Without quality education, discipleship is less effective but with excellent educational programs, such as those in the members of ILCS, discipleship is a natural process.

The next step in education is the university. Southeastern University (approaching 7,000 strong!) is now the largest school or institution in Assemblies of God history. SEU boasts the highest numbers of faculty with advanced and/or terminal degrees in their field of any school in our Fellowship. For the third consecutive year, we have been listed as one of the fastest growing and highest quality private, faith-based universities in the nation. This year we opened the new Live-Learn center, Buena Vida (the Good Life), on campus. With state-of-the-art classroom facilities, lecture halls, faculty offices, student housing, social areas and a food court, this building is the envy of private universities everywhere. We now offer degrees from freshmen classes, through Masters in several areas including a new Masters of Divinity, to Doctorates in Education and, for the first time ever, a Doctorate of Ministry. *President Kent Ingle* and the leadership team at SEU have become the standard for excellence in our Fellowship and on the national higher education scene. Learning is a core value and SEU provides the best possible environment for educational advancement on the under graduate and graduate levels.

MINISTERING

Athena and I count it a privilege to travel the highways and back roads of this beautiful peninsula to work with you, your churches and communities. In 2016 we drove a little over 30,000 miles and flew another 15,000 to preach for you, assist Pulpit Search Committees, attend district conventions and camps, teach DSOM classes, help resolve situations of all sorts, Install new Pastors, pray with you, and agree in faith for God's unfolding Will in many of your lives. This is the highest honor of all that we do. We were called to preach, not sit in an office. Though I actually enjoy office work, I could not survive without weekend ministry. I am humbled when you trust your pulpits to me and diligently study Scripture and ask the Holy Spirit to give messages that He can anoint and use for the glory of the Father. It is always a joy to speak, or at least attend if possible, at church anniversaries, pastoral anniversaries, weddings, baby dedications, and even family reunions. Working with our great Presbyters, enjoying sectional minister's fellowship meetings, and lending a hand in sectional matters are always fulfilling.

In addition, it is a great honor to serve on General Council task forces and operational committees, work with our World Missionaries, attend the annual AGWM Missions Renewal, the USMissions Leadership Conference (this year in Tampa Bay) the annual AG Executives Conference and the General Presbytery. I also enjoy serving on the Commission for Higher Education and the SEU Board of Trustees, as Chair. My membership on the Board of Church Extension Plan has connected many of you to loans, refinancing and new construction that was not available from any other financial source. CEP is a blessing to us and I am pleased to be a member of that financial ministry group.


I was again involved in a few legal situations but not nearly as many as recent years. I gave three depositions but was required to appear in only one actual trial, thank the Lord!

Southeastern University President's Report to the District



It is my privilege as president of Southeastern University to be able to share some highlights from this past year, as well as look ahead to the future for what God has planned for us. God has truly been at work in significant ways as we continue to fulfill our mission to equip students to discover and develop their divine design. Our primary focus continues to be on serving our students, while also serving and impacting our churches and communities.

Continued Growth at SEU

Once again in 2016-17, Southeastern University has experienced tremendous growth, with a record enrollment of 5,804 students. Over the past 10 years, SEU has seen a 95% increase, and was once again listed in *The Chronicle of Higher Education* as one of the top 10 fastest growing private nonprofit baccalaureate universities in the nation. Extended Education, which includes online programs, evening classes, and extension sites, now has more than 1,500 enrolled students. Southeastern currently has 45 extension site campuses all across the country and continues to grow.

Academically, Southeastern also continues to grow with new programs, including bachelor's degrees in Digital Media & Design and Business Analysis, a master's degree in International Community Development, and our second doctoral degree, the Doctor of Ministry. We conferred our first doctoral degree in Education at the fall commencement and our first class of nursing students will graduate this spring. Additionally, our Honors Program continues to grow in enrollment and GPA. Total enrollment in the Honors Program has grown from 33 in 2010 to 183 in 2016.

The fall semester brought the opening of our new Buena Vida building, a beautiful 125,000-square-foot live/learn facility. This unique building concept enables us to provide living facilities to over 380 students, as well as state-of-the-art classroom facilities, faculty offices, and a recently opened food court. The Buena Vida live/learn facility also houses the Jannetides College of Business & Entrepreneurial Leadership, as well as the recently opened College of Arts & Media Gallery, art design studios, music rehearsal rooms, a band practice room and the previously opened Choral Rehearsal Hall.



Spiritual Life on Campus

Southeastern continues to hold a vibrant spiritual life on campus. In addition to seven opportunities each week for students to attend a chapel service or Connect small group, freshman students can develop spiritual discipline through the First Year Experience mentoring groups. This year, 800 freshmen were part of 140 First Year Experience mentoring groups, being mentored by upperclassmen to help them develop discipline in their first transitional year.

Missions continues to be a huge focus at Southeastern. This past year, DestiNations, our SEU missions department, sent 506 students on 62 short-term mission trips all over the world. This is in addition to the thousands of hours of service our students provide to our local community. In fact, this year our students will have invested over 100,000 hours of service, travelled to 49 different countries on six continents, and affected the lives of almost 30,000 people worldwide!



SEU Conference, our annual spiritual emphasis week, was held over three days in February and welcomed thousands of students, pastors, staff and guests from around the country who came to hear incredible guest speakers such as Louie Giglio, Lisa Bevere, Robert Madu, Chad Veach, and more. During SEU Conference, SEU Worship also released its latest worship album with 11 worship songs written and recorded by our SEU Worship team.

At the conclusion of the 2017 SEU Conference, Southeastern University also announced the launch of the School of Worship, an innovative approach to training worship directors and campus pastors. The School of Worship will combine instrumental and vocal development academics with theological and ministerial courses, and will also focus on developing hands-on experience in worship leading, songwriting and service producing. Daniel Rivera, an SEU alumnus, is the Director for the School of Worship, and is working alongside SEU worship pastor David Cook, also an alumnus, who spent several years as a worship pastor and songwriter at Hillsong Church in Sydney, Australia. The School of Worship is the latest innovation in the College of Christian Ministries and Religion training of students for ministry. The College of Christian Ministries and Religion is not only the oldest and largest college at SEU, but also the fastest-growing, with 1,610 students currently enrolled in a ministry degree program.

Other 2016-17 Highlights

It is difficult to summarize the accomplishments and blessings of God in such a short report; however, here are just a few of the other highlights from this year:

- SEU Fire Athletics teams have made 17 NAIA National Tournament appearances since 2013. This year alone, Fire Athletics sent five teams and eight individuals to NAIA National Championships. Our Women's Basketball team had an undefeated regular season and made it to the Elite 8 in the National Championship before being eliminated.
- Our Alumni Association hosted its third Homecoming during football season, with alumni traveling from all over Florida, Alabama, Georgia and other states to attend this year's event. Additionally, the Alumni Association continues to host regional reunions across the country. This year's regional alumni events included reunions in Alabama, Texas, North Carolina, and Florida. Several more events are planned for 2017-18.
- Nearly 90% of SEU entering freshmen receive some form of financial aid, including 59% that receive an institutional grant. The average amount awarded institutionally exceeds 10 million dollars.
- The 11th annual Scholarship Gala was held March 10 and was the final event in the Leadership Forum Speaker Series, which welcomed hundreds of visitors to campus to hear nationally known speakers share insights on service and leadership.
- The Jannetides College of Business and Entrepreneurial Leadership Accounting program has received separate accreditation from ACBSP, which ensures that graduates of our B.S. in Accounting degree meet all requirements to sit for the CPA exam. The CPA pass rate for SEU graduates is over 80%, one of the highest in the country.
- Our College of Education has a 95% placement rate for interns over the past four years and an SEU senior has
 been selected as one of the top instructors of the year from the Florida Association of Teachers and Educators for
 nine years in a row.

Serving our students at a Christ-centered, student-focused institution is at the heart of what we do at Southeastern. This commitment extends beyond the statistics and the programs. It even extends beyond the chapel services and times of worship. It extends to each student as they leave Southeastern and prepare to go out to fulfill their God-inspired calling. And as a supporting district, church, or individual, you are also a part of each and every student's calling and each and every success. May God continue to bless and lead you!

We were encouraged, equipped and empowered to do the work of the ministry! We spent many hours around the altars in prayer for one another! God showed up and moved powerfully in each heart and life! When you make a place for Him, He comes!

Powette was powerful! We had about 980 women and girls gathered together at Camp Wilderness in Fort Meade. Michelle Tepper, with Ravi Zacharias Ministries, brought a powerful word! Our theme was "Unstoppable" and God showed Himself as an unstoppable God in so many ways! About 5 weeks before Powette, I received a phone call that the camp was flooded it was suggested that we may need to look for another location. I woke up a few nights later with the enemy in my ear saying over and over, "what are you going to do?" I got up after a while and began to pray and ask God what to do, asking Him what He wanted to do. I heard Him gently say, "Trust me." The next day I awoke early, with my Bible and notebook in hand, headed for my quiet place. I began to write out the promises of God and the scriptures where God showed Himself mighty. Every week I would go down to the camp and walk the grounds and pray. We had so much fun with a late-night scavenger hunt and black light party! The girls were also ministered to throughout the weekend in the services and then a special breakout session just for them on Friday afternoon! The last U.S. Census shows that women are the majority population in the United States by a slight margin and in the church they have historically been the greater margin. Not only are they typically the largest population of any pastor's congregation, but they have greater pressure, needs and influence than ever before.



Author Bev White Hislop says, "The physical, emotional, mental and spiritual needs of women may be greater than at any previous time in the history of the United States. There may have been more traumatic circumstances in the lives of American women, but there probably has not been a time when women have had fewer helpful connections and less effective shepherding."

These are only a few factors that contribute to ministry to women being an important focus of the church. We can't afford to not have specialized ministry for women. Thankfully we have leadership in our district that believes this, and are in 100% support of ministry to women.

Strengthening women in leadership who are on the frontlines is key, and we began our year doing just that at the STRONGER Conference. The general sessions, practical leadership tools and networking was a tremendous blessing to the 400+ female ministers, pastors' wives, women's ministry directors, business

women, up-and-coming leaders, and more. We continue to receive testimonies about how the Stronger Conference impacted lives.

PF Women hosted a leadership luncheon at District Council and this was a great occasion to share with ministerial leadership of our district about ways our department can serve them and what God is doing in PF Women. It was also occasion to refresh, renew and laugh as four of our pastors became stand-up comedians for the afternoon and entertained us. This was the greatest attended luncheon sponsored by our department in district accuracy bistory or as we are tald. We are appears



in district council history or so we are told. We are encouraged all of the support.

On the heels of district council, we hit the ground running with THE EXTRAVGANT TOUR that went to 18 cities in our district, all across the state. We gathered at altars from coast to coast, receiving God's extravagant love and believing for extravagant things for our lives, our churches, and our district.

Momentum continued to build for the upcoming THRIVE Conference. The most important thing that happened all weekend at THRIVE was that 17 women received Christ as Savior, and several hundred were baptized in the Holy Spirit. We are still receiving reports of healings and lives changed through connecting with others in the sisterhood that is PF Women. We had 20 new churches who participated and pretty quickly sold out of the largest room block in our history!

PF Women Talk Radio continues to reach out all over Pen Florida and around the globe with important subjects that affect today's woman. Our online presence continues to increase as we engage women daily in conversation.

Touch the World missions has gone to a whole new level, as we took a team of women from our district to Kenya for 16 days in November. While there we ministered at the National Assemblies of God Women's Conference for Kenya, at the Kenya Teen Challenge, in the Mathare Valley Slums, and many

local churches. All in all we did over 26 services or presentations. Pen Florida women raised the funds to provide furnishings for both the women's and men's dormitories of East University (AG) where ministerial students are trained. We also raised funds to provide a scholarship for a woman to attend the university. And, we raised funds to provide meals for children in the Mathare Valley slums for 3 months as well as provided school shoes and curriculum for the year.

PF Women continues to raise funds for Touch the World to provide for our Pen Florida missionaries household goods, as well. And our missionary adoption program is going strong for the second year in a row and provides each missionary or missionary family with an adopting church who provides extra TLC in the way of gifts on special occasions and prayer support. Special thanks to Shay Cole who leads the adoption program and does such a great job.

We are so thankful to all of our supporting churches as well as our 1000 Sister partners who make the advancement of PF Women possible. For the third year in a row we are in the black and able to do more for God than we have ever done, thanks to His empowerment and your giving.

We are gearing up for this spring/summer tour: THE JOY TOUR 2017. We will be making stops in 17 cities and are believing for amazing things as we move forward in the purpose, power and presence of God.

THRIVE 2017 is on track to be an unforgettable time in the presence of God. We will gather October 12-14 at the Daytona Hilton Beachfront Resort. Evangelist Beth Stephens, Jennifer Beckham, and Carol Kent will be among those bringing a life-changing word to our women. We will have breakout sessions for teen girls, young adults, women in ministry and more.



If I could accomplish something all on my own it would be pretty small. I am so grateful that everything that is done within PF Women happens through a TEAM. Our team works together in such love, joy and unity and it just gets stronger all the time. I am so appreciative of all of their prayer, passion and hard

work that they pour into what we do for God. I am especially thankful for my assistant – Erika Hendricks, who has served with such excellence and loyalty. Someone recently said to me that they love watching how we work together and I said, "You can get amazing things accomplished with this kind of loyalty." As most in the district are already aware, Erika has accepted a pastoral staff position in Maryland and will be transitioning the first week of June. Words can't even convey our gratefulness for her leadership and labors of love. PF Women would not be where it is today without her! We will miss her terribly, and at the same time we are grateful for a gift God has provided in Judi Cotignola. She is my new assistant and is a longtime supporter of this ministry and a loyal friend. I am confident that the bond we already have will serve us well as we work together to fulfill the purposes of God.

Tammy Stanley serves at the Youth Department's assistant. She works tirelessly to make sure all the details of our events are covered as well as a plethora of other administrative needs for PFYouth. Jinny Force helped in major ways for the PFYouth Leaders Conference and District Fine Arts. Lenore Casal has stepped into the role effortlessly. Lenore's passion for ministry, for the young ladies and pastors' wives of our district is evident in her prayers and all she does in helping plan for the events. What a blessing to have her by my side as a partner in ministry.

The PFYouth Leaders Conference was held February 25-27 at Faith Assembly of God in Orlando. We saw 400 youth leaders from churches all over our district come and grow together. Six main sessions were led by Al Force, Jeremy Donovan, Johnnie Wilson, Phil Urdiales and Doug Witherup. There were 24 breakout sessions that were specifically focused for the lead youth pastor, volunteer leaders, as well as leadership development. PFYouth has amazing pastors and volunteers that believe in this generation of students and have sacrificed so much of their time to see young people changed and transformed. Since leadership development is a core value of PFYouth there is a high priority placed on who is brought in to share in both main sessions and breakouts.

Bible Quiz is an awesome discipleship tool that challenges students to not just read the Word, but to memorize the Word. **Joshua 1:8** "This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have good success."

Junior Bible Quiz represented well! Pen Florida was able to send four teams to the National JBQ Festival. They placed in the following manner:

- Lakeland Victory Church 20th Place
- Port Saint Lucie Highpoint Church 71st Place
- Fruitland Park LIFE Church 77th place
- Orlando Faith Assembly of God 82nd place.

With the exception of Orlando Faith Assembly, this was the first time at Nationals in a long time for the remaining three teams.

Teen Bible Quiz also did in incredible job! Wesley Chapel Victorious Life Church and Jacksonville Freedom Christian Fellowship qualified to advance to the National Bible Quiz Finals in Springfield, Missouri. The teams placed first and third, respectively, at Regional Finals, where Wesley Chapel was undefeated. Although Jacksonville was unable to make the trip to Nationals, Wesley Chapel represented PF Youth by tying for 14th in the nation. Senior quizzer Shannon Wolf (WC) was 10th in the nation in individual scoring.

Chi Alpha continues to change the face of colleges all across our state. We are seeing some remarkable things happen on the college campuses. Our campus pastors in the state include Rev. Steve Michaels who has made a sideways transition from the main campus pastor to solely focusing on international students at the University of Florida; Rev. Joe Lortie from the University of Miami; Rev. Charmaine Townsend from the University of Central Florida, Rev. Chris Kennedy at the University of South Florida. Rev. Chris Wheeler who has officially been accepted and appointed to be a Chi Alpha Internship center out of Fort Myers First Assembly of God; and Rev. Lee Jenkins focuses on the Muslim students that attend University of South Florida. We are so thankful for all of their incredible work for the Kingdom.

The Fine Arts Festival is such a great tool not just to develop and deploy their gifts but also a great way for them to be discipled. Our district festival was held April 28-20 at Faith Assembly in Orlando, where we saw over 1,700 students participate in over 1,500 events. We are proud of those who advanced and participated in the National Fine Arts Festival on August 3-7 in Louisville, Kentucky. It is surreal seeing the amount of students who participate at the National Level from Pen Florida! The talent that this district is blessed with is incredible. A big thank you to Pen Florida District Kids Ministries Director Sydney Morrow and her team for leading an amazing 2 weeks of kids camp.

Miami Missions Over 120 AIMers went into Miami on June 13-17 and served the people and shared the Gospel in a great way! Students were able to work on local schools and help prepare for the coming year and show the true meaning of servant evangelism. They also were able to hit the streets and minister one-on-one with people in Miami and saw many touched by the power of God. Miami Missions is continuing to evolve and we are looking to a great year ahead. So thankful for David Houck and his team for leading the way and truly believing in one of the most powerful trips a student can go on as they reach those in their own back yard!

Costa Rica We had such an incredible time! We had over 20 go on the trip to work with Missionaries Jay and Nancy Dickerson. We were able to connect with a local school and hold "Campamento Chicos y Chicas" which brought over 50

children in 5th and 6th grades in from a local school. Many of these young girls and boys have been abused both physically and sexually and they had many walls put up, but God moved and within the first day he broke down walls and changed their lives. We had small groups with them playing soccer, volleyball and even taught them American football. I even had a few of them chanting the Philadelphia Eagles fight song! What an amazing experience this was. We are thankful to Brandon Strickler from Fort Myers First Assembly for leading this team as well as Eric Delaney of Jacksonville Southside, Sam Neal of North Fort Myers Faith, and Emily Thomas from Interlachen Bethel. They brought their students and leaders and made an impact in Costa Rica for the Kingdom of God.

Fusion This is one of our largest events! It is an awesome time for students to come for two days and get their lives significantly impacted! Fusion was held at Orlando Calvary on November 11-12. We saw over 2500 students and leaders attend this year's Fusion. Planetshakers led in worship, Chris Durso spoke on night one, Joe Gordon shared for our Speed the Light service, and Rich Wilkerson Jr. closed us out. The Holy Spirit was evident, the intimate atmosphere of worship was special and God moved in many lives.

Speed the Light is what missionaries depend on for essential transportation and creative communication to see souls saved and lives changed. It has been incredible to see all that Speed the Light has provided this past year. In 2016, \$428,570.12 was raised for Pen Florida Speed the Light. 


